Upgrades Facilities with Help from CCC Foundation

NonBookLibrary is an award-winning institution that provides a wide range of services, including community outreach and support for the CCC Foundation. The foundation provides support for the library's operations, including the purchase of new equipment and the renovation of the library's facilities.

In 2008-09, Library Director Marc Wildman used \$45,000 of the Robinsons' gifts to purchase new instructional technology for the library. In the 1980s, the library's space was limited and the library's facilities were outdated. The library's facilities were more team-based and interactive," he continued.

Cayuga Community College Foundation

In 2008-09, the attention of the Foundation—and of the world—focused on the precipitous decline in investments. Cayuga Community College Foundation's investments returned.

CCC Foundation's investment strategy minimized the negative impact which the recession had on our investments. By fiscal year-end 2009, our portfolio had rebounded to 85% of its highest total value of (\$11 million) in early 2008.

CCC Foundation continues its strong support to Cayuga's initiatives in entrepreneurship. In 2008-09, our donors provided nearly \$600,000 in capital support for the Stardust Entrepreneurial Institute. Much of this came from a five-year, \$1 million contract with the Stardust Foundation Center for Workforce

Development. \$119,000 in contract projects promoting e-shop education. Cayuga earned these competitive grants through its partnership with Auburn Community College in Kansas City, Missouri. Kaufman is the recognized leader in entrepreneurship education in America. Professor Thomas Paczkowski (Auburn Community College Class of '72) coordinated these e-shop projects and grants in his role as the Fred I. Emerson Foundation, Inc. Executive Director.

Support for student scholarships and grants remained strong in 2008-09. The Foundation provided over \$280,000 in financial assistance, returning support to our students.

Total Foundation income in 2008-09 was \$844,000 including \$232,000 of in-kind support. Among the largest gifts received over the past two years were those from the Stardust Foundation of Central New York, the Stardust Foundation of Arizona, the First Interstate Bank Foundation, the D.E. Freeman Foundation, the First Foundation, the Ewin Foundation, the Foundation for the Study of the History of the Auburn Community College Foundation.

Our donors are our strength. In 2007-08, we received over \$500,000 in planned gifts from our supporters. We are grateful to our donors who stand upon us through such gifts and stand ready to assist others who may wish to realize the long-term benefits of planned giving.
